



## COUNTRIES WITH MOST CASUALTIES


Since the first peacekeeping mission in 1948, over 3,000 peacekeepers have died while serving. Over the years, the following 10 troop contributing countries have suffered the most casualties:

## FATALITIES IN PEACEKEEPING MISSIONS




Cause of death by malicious acts has been increasing compared to deaths by accidents and illness.

## INJURIES FROM MALICIOUS ACTS




## SNAPSHOT: UN MISSION IN MALI

Today, Mali is the most dangerous peacekeeping mission with nearly a third of all security incidents (kidnappings, direct attacks, violent protests, etc.) compared with all other missions.
